## **Moss Scholars IS NOT...**

- A one-on one coaching program where students learn to create to-do lists, prioritize assignments, and chunk large assignments into smaller pieces
- A coach checks in with the student to see how they are adjusting to school
- A coach encourages each student to sign up for activities, events around campus, tutoring, workshops, and university resources.
- A coach assists each student with reviewing required courses, analyzing learning styles and matching with appropriate professors.

- A Special Education Program that teaches or reteaches the materials to the students.
- A program providing homework assistance.
- A program providing licensed counselors.
- A program that replaces Academic Advisors.
- A program that provides a personal assistant who will get a student out of bed, out of their room, make them socialize, or make them attend events, classes, or counseling.

## **Student Access Services**

How are we different from Student Access Services?

- <u>Student Access Services</u> provides accommodations for all Bradley students who have a documented disability. This service is free of charge and easy to navigate!
- The Moss Scholars Program is a fee-based program that provides one-on-one coaching for neurodiverse students! The students would still get their federally protected (and free) accommodations provided by Student Access Services, but the coach would help them with an additional layer of support! The coach would help plan classes, study times, large assignments, and establish good habits. The coach also helps students communicate with professors about their accommodations, questions, and concerns.
- A separate application, submission of paperwork, and recommendations are required for the Moss Scholars Program. There are a limited number of spots available each year, so it is important to apply as soon as you decide that Bradley University is your choice!
- What if you don't have a documented disability? That does become a bit tricky! However, all is not lost! You can speak with our head of Student Access Services (link to us on the staff page) or the Moss Scholars Coordinator (link to us on the staff page) and they will help you navigate how to pursue documentation and what to do while you wait!
